GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Players are expected to read the rulebook from the Tournament Director for information on the format, rules, schedule of play, and so forth. We encourage you to allow plenty of time before and after the event for travel. The accepted practice is to arrive at least one day prior to the start of play. Neither Predator nor WPA are responsible for airline delays, lost luggage, traffic jams or any other travel-related issue that could cause you to miss or arrive late for your first match. Matches are not delayed or accelerated to accommodate travel issues. Therefore, you are advised to arrive no later than the day before the event begins and leave no sooner than the day after the event ends.

This is a WPA sanctioned event. Except where indicated otherwise, official WPA Rules of Play, Regulations and Sports Regulations apply. In the case of discrepancy between official WPA Rules of Play, WPA Regulations and the Tournament Directors document, provisions of the Tournament Directors document will apply. Where it is not possible to resolve the discrepancies, the final decision will be made by the Sports Administration of the event. For administrative matters related to the event, the final authority is Director of Predator Events Vincent Rochefort, or in his absence, the lead PBS Coordinator on-site.

Event Format, Seeding and Races:

32 teams, double elimination to last 8, then single elimination.

Races: Double elimination: best of 3 sets, race to 4. Single elimination: best of 3 sets, race to 4. If the score is 3-3 in the deciding set, shootout determines the winner.

Schedule:

The athlete must be present in the venue 30 minutes before their match is scheduled. The match may be announced up to 30 minutes earlier than the scheduled start time and must start within 15 minutes after the announcement or at the scheduled time, whichever is later. Practice on the match table can only take place after the match is announced and before the scheduled or latest permitted start time. Practice time must be shared fairly, the recommended approach is 1 rack per athlete. If the athlete is more than 15 minutes late for the match (defined as 15 minutes after the scheduled time, or 15 minutes after the announcement, whichever is later), they will forfeit the match.

SHOOTOUT

MIXED DOUBLES

Shootout will require players to shoot twice in a row at opposite sides: Player 1 Side A, Player 1 Side B, Player 2 Side A, Player 2 Side B, and so forth.

The goal is to pocket the object ball in its designated pocket. To determine a winner the following system will be used:

- The winner of the lag at the start of the match decides the starting player of the shootout, alternating turns thereafter. One turn by each player is an inning.
- The starting player determines the starting side from which the shootout will begin. Sides will alternate thereafter for each inning.
- Players will shoot four (4) innings in alternating turns. Both players get an equal number of turns.
- The player with the most points (i.e. balls pocketed) after four innings wins.
- If both players are tied after four innings, the order of play will remain until a player reaches a score that cannot be tied by his opponent in the same inning. This is called "Sudden Death."
 - In Sudden Death, the cue ball must be moved one diamond behind the head string.
- Shot clock extensions may not be used during a shootout.

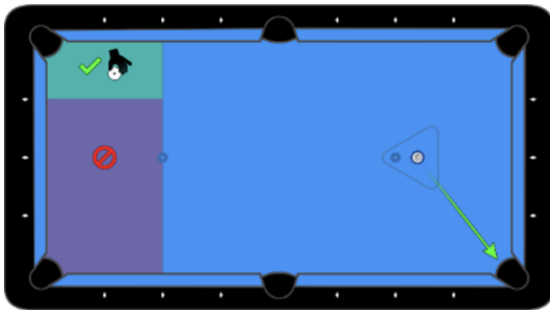
For a shot to be considered legal, the following rules in terms of position and placement must be executed:

- The 10-Ball will be used as the object ball during the entire shootout. The position of the object ball corresponds to its original position in a standard 10-Ball rack.

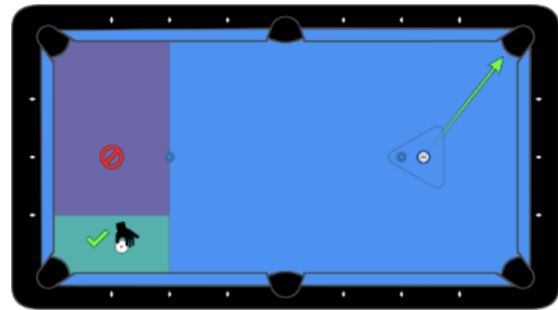


- Referee places the 10-ball. Players may not approach or inspect the object ball or ask for a re-spot.
- There are two zones designated for the shootout, the left and right side, shown below. The player must place the cue ball within the designated zone and pocket the 10-ball in the opposite corner pocket as shown below.
- Players must alternate the zone after each inning.
- The zones can be recognized according to the following parameters:
 - The left side is on the left side of the table while facing the object ball.
 - The right side is on the right side of the table while facing the object ball.
 - In Sudden Death, the cue ball must be moved back one diamond behind the head string.

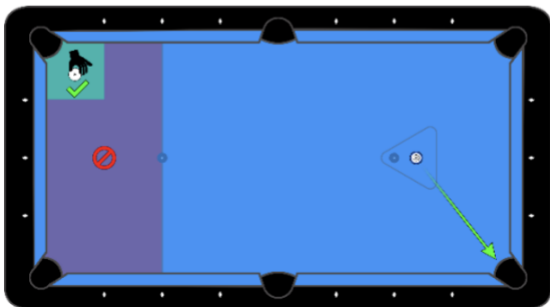
Regulation Shootout (Left Side)



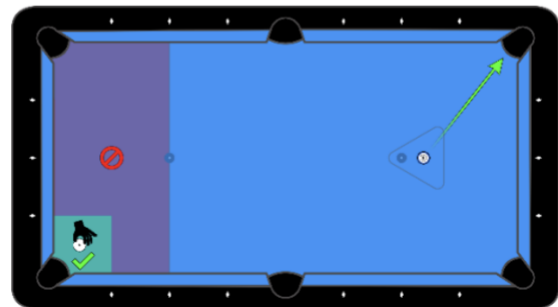
Regulation Shootout (Right Side)

In addition to the standard WPA rules and regulations, additional rules that are in place that determine whether an inning is considered legal are as following:

- The execution of the shot must be done within the timeframe that has been determined. This can be based on a shot clock ruling or the decision of the acting referee.
- The object ball must be pocketed in its designated pocket. If the object ball is pocketed in any other pocket, it will be considered as a miss.
- A shot that includes the rails, being or resembling a bank or a kick, will be considered a miss.



DRESS CODE

APPROVED CLOTHING

Pants

Long dress pants; no shorter than 2 inches above the ankle. Women may wear skirt or dress which cover the knees. Colors: neutral, solid colors - beige, brown, dark blue, dark green, gray. and black.

Denim material is not allowed except dark black color and not ripped.

Shoes

Clean black shoes (Closed toe)

Sandals/ flip-flops/ crocks (or similar) are not allowed.

Shirt

Clean collared sleeve (long or short) shirt or polo of any color. Shirt or polo must be tucked in. Women may wear an elegant top, a blouse or a dress which needs to cover the shoulders.

A full zipped jacket is allowed (hoodies are not allowed). T-shirts are not allowed.

Same logo rules apply to shirt, polo- and jackets

PROHIBITED CLOTHING

Under no circumstances will the organization accept any of these clothing:

- Athletic wear of any kind, including but not limited to sweats, swimwear, jogging suits, uniforms, jerseys, or any type of pants with contrasting stripes not associated with formal wear.
- Shorts of any kind, regardless of apparent length. Pants must be normal in respect to the appropriate rise in relation to the length of garment and may not be excessively baggy or loose fitting.
- Overalls, coveralls, jeans, hats, headphones, or earpieces (unless medical need, proof required)

LOGOS & PATCHES

Up to 6 commercial sponsors spots 6 sq/inch or 38.4 sq/cm

Up to 3 apparel manufacturer logo 3 sq/inch or 19.2 sq/cm

If a manufacturer logo is bigger than 3 sq/inch or 20 sq/cm, it will account for a commercial logo.

These logos should be placed in positions 1-6 and/or C on the diagram. Text on jerseys will be treated as a sponsor logo, unless it is the athlete's name, nickname, or country they represent.

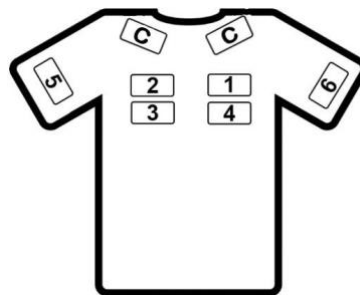
No Full back logos.

Back can be - 1 in the top of the back and ONLY for apparel manufacturer logo player's name, country's name or flag.

In addition, the Pro Billiard Series may provide athletes with one additional patch for the event. This should be displayed as shown in position (1) on the image.

Logos may not exceed sixty-five (65) square centimeters. Logos should only be worn in the positions shown in the image to the right.

The organization reserves the authority to disallow any sponsor logos for any reason.
